

Wet Weather



The Department of Education is required to ensure the safety and well-being of its students and staff. The wet weather policy outlines the responsibilities and procedures for staff and students in the instance of heavy rain and/or an electric storm, during school hours and on dismissal of students at home time. Students will not necessarily be dismissed at home time if there is heavy rainfall or an electrical storm. The Principal will decide at the time, and students will be dismissed when it is judged safe for them to make their way home. If there is an impending storm, parents may come earlier to collect their children from their classroom.



The following are important tips and strategies for children to protect themselves:

- ◆ Know your name, address, and phone number.
- ◆ Use the buddy system – avoid walking anywhere alone.
- ◆ Trust your instincts – if you feel you are being followed or something is not right, seek help immediately.
- ◆ If a stranger approaches you, you do not have to speak to him or her. Never approach a stranger in a motor vehicle. Just keep walking. Do not accept candy or any other items from a stranger. Never walk off with a stranger no matter what he or she tells you.
- ◆ If someone is following you try to remember the license plate of his or her vehicle and immediately tell a trusted adult.

If a stranger grabs you, do everything you can to stop him or her from pulling you away or dragging you into his or her car. Drop to the ground and do whatever it takes to attract the attention of others who can help you. If someone is dragging you away, scream, "this is not my dad," or "this is not my mom."

Asthma & EpiPen Medication



Parents/Carers are reminded that all medication such as Asthma Puffers—Preventative Medicine and EpiPens must be collected from the school reception on the last day of the school. This allows parents to check use by dates and review Asthma and Anaphylaxis plans to ensure they are current for the new school year.

Asthma Action Plans should be reviewed, updated and signed by their child's doctor at least annually.
