Goal Sharing and Family BBQ

Teachers and students are preparing for the Goal Sharing Meeting which is an opportunity to visit your child's class and hear about your child's learning goals. It will take place on **Tuesday 9 March (3.30pm-6.30pm)**. No bookings are required however if you will be visiting more than one classroom, allow about 15/20 minutes per room. All classrooms will be open for all families from Preschool to Year 6. Our Defence School Mentor, PE, Performing Arts and Special Education teachers will open their rooms up. We will be holding a family BBQ so please contact the office if you can volunteer for half an hour or so. We look forward to showcasing our goals for the year and opening our doors. **Sausage sandwiches and drinks will be on sale in the undercover assembly area from 3-6pm!**

What will happen at the Goal Sharing Meeting?

At a Goal Sharing Meeting the student leads the meeting and will have planned goals and actions to share with their parents. There may be four or five families in the classroom at the same time. **Parents and students can visit classrooms at any time between 3.30-6.30pm.**

What if I want a one on one parent-teacher interview?

Some parents feel that they the Goal Sharing Meeting has not given them the opportunity to discuss their child's achievements, behaviour and social issues directly and privately with their teacher. Parents are asked to make an appointment for another day to discuss these issues directly with their teacher. Appointments with teachers can be made at any stage during the year.

School Council – We Need You!

School Council is an opportunity to work with other parents and teachers to provide relevant input to decisions being made by the school and DoE. Our School Council will be looking for **four new members** this year, with two executive positions vacant (Chair and Secretary). Please make an appointment with me if you would like to discuss school council membership. Our **AGM will be held 5.30pm on Thursday, 11 March**, in the staffroom. The AGM will be followed by a NT COGSO school council Governance Training session to support our new and existing council members.

Safety in the Car Park

A few friendly reminders about safety at the end of the school day. First of all, for families using the carparks: vehicles are **not** to be left unattended or for extended periods of time in the drop off/pick up zones. If there is not space available in the pickup zone, drivers are asked to either find a carpark or drive through again and then access the pickup zone. When cars stop at or beside the crossing for pickups this creates a safety hazard and congestion for other vehicles. Do not park on verges or at the end of the pickup/ drop off zone. Students should not walk between cars in the pickup zone – ask your child to get in the car from the 'safe side'. In wet weather, car parks can be very dangerous, so have safe car park practices at all times. Secondly, students who are waiting for brothers or sisters at Palmerston College are asked to wait at the front of the school or at the bus stop if they are catching a bus. If you are waiting for a Palmerston College student, please find a park – **do not wait in the pickup zones for students from Palmerston College**. This prevents traffic to flow and causes safety hazards. Lastly, a reminder to all students riding scooters and bikes to always wear a helmet and always walk scooters and bikes through the school grounds. **STAY SAFE TRAVELING TO AND FROM SCHOOL!**

Attendance

Attendance has a direct impact on student achievement! Sending children to school is the responsibility of parents and families. Parents have to get their children to school **EVERY DAY**. Parents/carers are responsible for **notifying** the school when their child is not at school. This can be done in any one of the following ways:

- Phone call to the school's absentee line (Ph: 7923 0140)
- Email school or teacher
- A message directly to your child's teacher
- A personal visit to the school's Reception
- A note to be given to the teacher on the next school day.

You must let the school know if your child is going to be absent, the reason for absence and the expected day of return to school. Unnotified or unacceptable absences may result in the Department of Education Engagement Officers contacting you.

School hours are 8:00am to 2:20pm and the first part of the day is usually the most important with a focus on explicit teaching in literacy and numeracy. Children arriving late or leaving early must do so through Reception.


