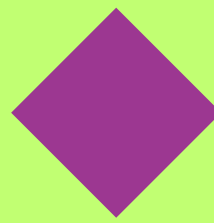
Class Spotlight: Year 1 Pathak



This term, students have been learning about procedural text writing. We explored how to write clear and detailed step-by-step instructions by making our very own fairy bread. Students identified the important features of a procedural text, including a title, ingredients, equipment, and method. They practiced using sequencing words such as “first,” “next,” “then,” and “finally” to help make their instructions easy to follow. The fairy bread activity was a fun and engaging way for students to build their writing skills while enjoying a tasty treat together!



Class Spotlight: Year 1 Pathak



This term in Numeracy, students have been learning about patterns. We explored different types of patterns using numbers, shapes, colours, and objects. Students practiced identifying, continuing, and creating their own repeating and growing patterns. Through hands-on activities and games, students developed their problem-solving and critical thinking skills while building confidence in recognising how patterns work in everyday life.

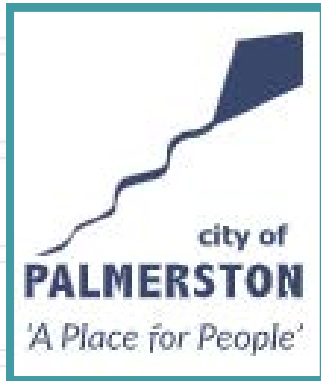
